



HOME REMEDY MATTRESS CLEANING TIPS

1. **A Mixture That Works Wonders** -- Mix up dry suds with a warm cup of water and a quarter of a cup of mild powdered detergent. Beat an egg with it, using a whisk or an egg beater, and wait until suds form, and the whole mixture starts to look like whipped cream. Apply this to the mattress using a sponge. Wipe the affected area with a sponge dipped in warm water. This will help wring the residue out.
2. **Hydrogen Peroxide** -- If you are dealing with a bloodstain on your mattress, hydrogen peroxide will do the trick. Blot the stain using a white towel, from the outside going in. You will notice bubbles forming. Keep doing this until blood is no longer seeping onto your white towel. You must remember, though, that using hydrogen peroxide is not effective all the time, not because it is a bad product, but because there are bloodstains that have stayed on the mattress for so long, making them impossible to remove.
3. **Upholstery Shampoos** -- You can use upholstery shampoo, but only the high-quality type. Upholstery shampoo can be bought anywhere. The trick to using this product is to use it as soon as possible, or immediately after the stain is created. Treat the surface with the product to remove stains and odour.
4. **Vinegar Magic** -- If you are dealing with urine stains, do the same trick that you did for bloodstains. If not, you can also use white vinegar and blot the mattress with it.
5. **Soap And Water Will Do** -- If the stain can be easily removed, you don't need to rush to the grocery store for a bottle of hydrogen peroxide. Sometimes, soap and water will effectively remove stains. Most mattress manufacturers recommend this tip. Just pour or spread the mixture over the stained area. After this, blot thoroughly using kitchen towel and then dry it with a towel that absorbs moisture well. Drying should be done as thoroughly as possible.

IMPORTANT - Keep in mind that you should never use products that seep into the padding of your mattress. Residual moisture will create mildew and mould on your mattress. Replace your sheets and mattress pads only once the mattress is completely dry.
